Learn to Skate Classes

We offer United States Figure Skating Curriculum (USFS), the national governing body for figure skating in the US and the precursor for USA Hockey and International competitive figure skating. Our Learn to Skate programs are badge programs that reward students for mastering skills in their level. Parents are encouraged to stay and watch from the lobby or bleachers but not from the players' box.

Sessions

Session 3 classes are 6 weeks beginning on Saturday, January 2nd, with testing on the 6th week.

Session 4 classes begin on Saturday, February 20th, with testing on the 6th week, followed by two additional weeks of Ice Show rehearsals. **** Session 4 Saturday classes will test on the 4th week and each class will last 1 hour and 10 minutes instead of the regular 45 minutes. This is due to the back to back hockey tournaments that take place the last two weekends in March. Saturday classes will also include two additional weeks of Ice Show rehearsals in April.**

Drop-in Skate (Practice sessions)

A special practice time is set aside ONLY for those currently enrolled in Learn to Skate classes and for their families. This is the perfect opportunity to get out and skate with your little ones that are in our program or for advanced skaters to practice those more difficult maneuvers that are difficult to practice during public skate sessions.

This year's theme is "One Skate Two Skate Red Skate Blue Skate", and promises to be a lot of fun! Enrollment in Learn to Skate Session 4 classes includes participation in our awesome annual Spring Ice Show. Don't miss out!

CLASSES

Program Class (Open to all levels) This new class is a must for skaters of any level, including Snowplow Sam who are interested in participating in our upcoming figure skating competition on February 13th & 14th. The instructor will select appropriate music and prepare a competition ready routine for the skater. This is the perfect introduction into the sport of figure skating for any level skater. Class size is very limited so enroll early. Session 3 only.

Snowplow Sam 1, 2 & 3 Snowplow Sam levels are for preschoolers, ages 3-5. These classes are designed to develop preliminary coordination and strength necessary to maneuver on ice independently. Skills include proper falling and getting up techniques as well as balance, marching and gliding maneuvers. Skills in Snowplow Sam classes are taught primarily through fun and games. Levels 1 & 2 are taught together. Bike helmets and gloves are recommended. Classes are 35 minutes long with 5 minutes of off-ice warm ups every class.

**Basic 1 classes and above are 45 minutes long with a 15 minute warm up/ practice and 30 minutes of instruction.

Basic Skills 1-8 There are 8 levels of "Basic Skills" that help the student to master the fundamentals of the sport. Basic 1, 2 & 3 levels are designed for learning balance, stroking and edge control. Basic 4 & 5 focus on forward and backward crossovers. Basic 6-8 teach more advance turns and edges and introduce the figure skaters to elementary freestyle techniques of spins, jumps and spirals. All students progress through these levels at different rates, and some levels may require repetition in order to master. Bike helmets and gloves are recommended for Basic 1 skaters. Levels may be combined due to enrollment.

Special Olympics This curriculum is designed for our skaters with special needs. The program allows the athletes to learn skills in progressive order. Skaters that complete the 12 levels of Special Olympics courses can transfer into the Basic Skills curriculum.

Hockey 1-4 Our hockey curriculum is designed to teach the skater the basic skills that are specifically geared for future hockey players. Upon completion of the four badge levels, the skater will learn how to maneuver faster and be more agile on the ice. Proper beginning skating techniques are the primary focus and all elements are taught without the use of a hockey stick or puck. Register for Hockey 1 after completion or instead of Basic 1 if you know that playing hockey is your future goal. Bike helmets and gloves are recommended for first time skaters.

Adult 1-4 The Adult curriculum is designed for the beginning adult skater. It will promote physical fitness as well as improve balance and coordination while learning proper skating techniques. For those adults that skated in their youth but wish to build on their skills, this is the perfect class for you, too. All four levels are taught together, however the instructors will decide which level placement is appropriate for the individual, and create the lesson plan to accommodate each adult individually.

Free skate 1-6 Upon completion of the Basic Skills levels, the student is ready for Free skate 1 class. These classes focus on more advanced techniques of freestyle spins and jumps, Moves in the Field, and dance/footwork techniques. All students progress through these levels at different rates, and some levels may require repetition in order to master.

My Tot & Me This class is designed for moms, dads or a grandparent to learn to skate with your preschool toddler. The instructor will introduce the parent and toddler to preliminary skills of skating such as proper falling and getting up techniques, balance, gliding and marching maneuvers. The skills will be taught primarily through games played between parent and child. Classes are 35 minutes long with 5 minutes of off-ice warm ups every class. Session 3 Only.

All skating classes require membership in USFSA. \$10 fee valid thru June 30, 2010.

ADVANCED COURSES

Group Showcase This class teaches a group routine for skaters to perform in the spring show. This year's theme is "One Skate Two Skate Red Skate Blue Skate" so we will have a lot of fun in this class! We will have 2 or 3 groups, high and low levels to be divided based upon enrollment. 2-3 additional weekend rehearsals are required. Session 4 only.

Moves in the Field Open to those who have passed Basic 8. Will focus on Pre-preliminary through Senior level moves with specific instruction tailored to the needs of the individual student. Session 3 only.

Show Class All skaters Free skate 1 and higher wishing to perform a solo or duet routine in the spring show must sign up for this class. This year's theme is "One Skate Two Skate Red Skate Blue Skate", and promises to be a lot of fun! Skaters enrolled in this class will be expected to meet approximately 4 times over a 7 week period per routine. 2-3 additional weekend rehearsals will be required. **Registration deadline for this class is January 15th.** Specific rehearsal dates for skaters will be handed out individually by mid February. Session 4 only.

Theatre on Ice This new class is open to skaters who have passed Basic 4 and higher. TOI teaches choreography based on emotional themes, processes, skating movements, and rapport between skaters in the group. Session 3 only.

Ice Dancing- Session 4 only.

Power Stroking- Session 3 only.

Learn to Play Hockey

This beginning hockey program is a supplement to our Learn to Skate Hockey Program. In this class, you will learn the basic skills needed in order to excel in the game. Skating, puck control, passing/receiving, shooting, defensive tactics, and offensive tactics will be introduced and taught throughout the program that will meet once a week for six weeks. Full protective gear is not required but is recommended for your safety. Skates, helmet, and stick are required and may be available at no additional cost.
