Re: Pennington County Library Use – 2016 Review

Summary:

County residents made up 18% of the total library card holders of the Rapid City Public Library in 2016.

In 2017, there are a number of factors expected to increase the value of library services for Pennington County users.

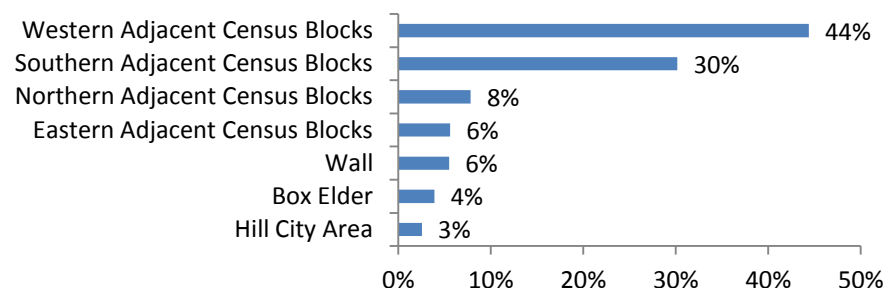
- County patrons digital usage increased to over 18% of all the digital checkouts. The collection is being developed and expanded for all formats.
- The C.H.A.O.S. Makerspace will be adding the following services in 2017: programmable robots, a laser cutter, a large format printer, and a kids only building area.
- Experience bags will be added as a new collection and the new video game and board game collections are being expanded.

Background:

The following table shows comparative data on use of the Rapid City Public Library by Pennington County residents since 2015.

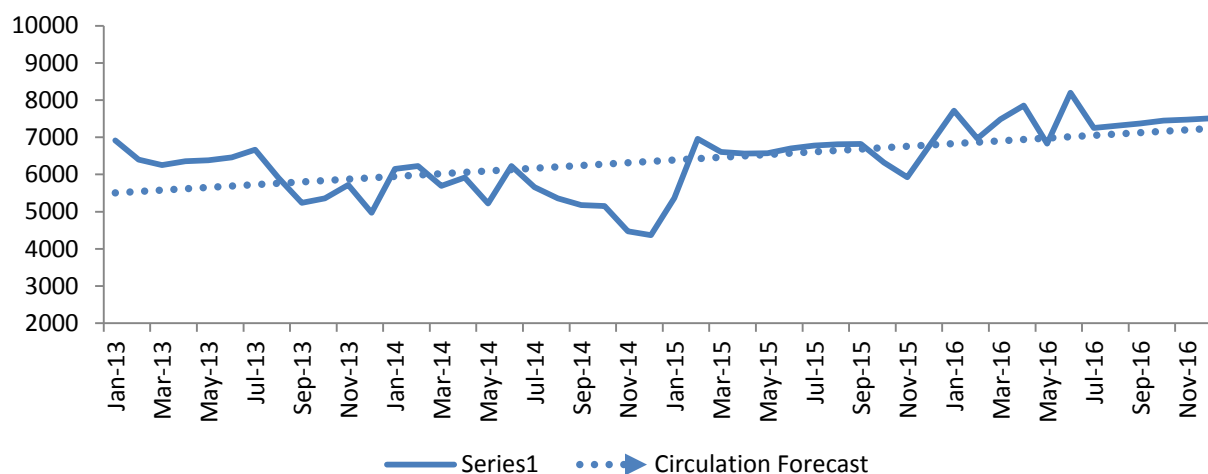

Percentage of Pennington County Users by Area (based on 2012 census tracts)

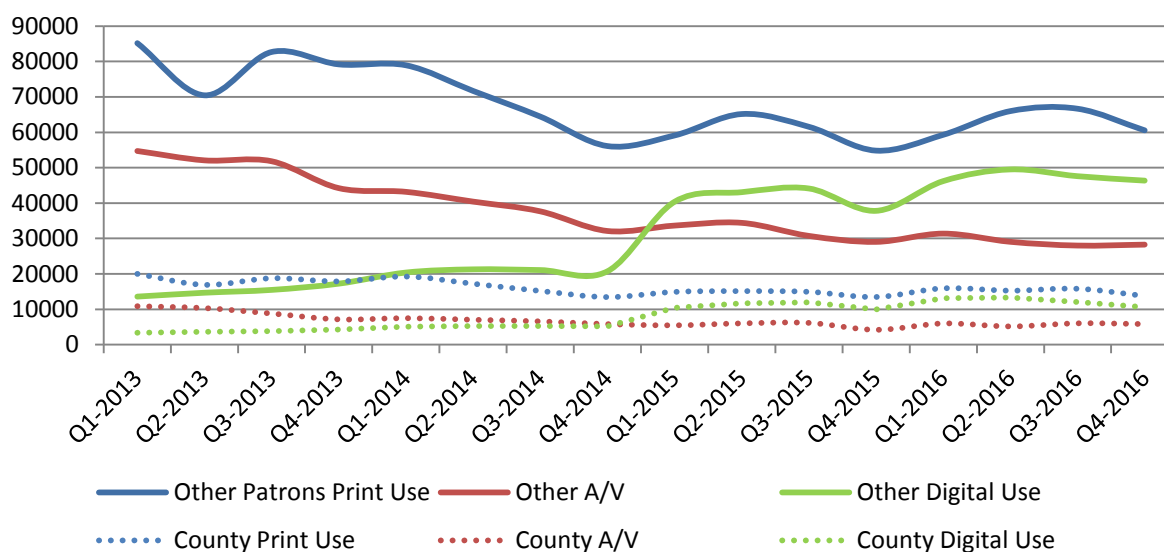


The graphs below show circulation patterns over the last four years. In 2014, the statistics definitions for digital circulations were changed to be more in line with traditional definitions of a circulation.

Downloadable Materials	<p>Downloadable and/or eBooks, audiobooks, and videos accessed via specialized e-readers, computers, smartphones, or other mobile devices.</p> <p>RCPL's downloadable titles & streaming titles are among the most heavily-used and growing collections. 127,419 eBooks, eAudio, digital videos, music albums, and magazines were streamed or downloaded in 2016.</p>	Individual Material Downloads
Social Networking	<p>An online community which creates content and shares information through the relation of ideas, pictures, posts, events, and interests. For example, Pinterest, Facebook, YouTube.</p> <p>RCPL uses these networks as tools to provide information about library programs, events, and services.
