Executive Director's Update

Heitsch wanted to update the Board on some projects. Rushmore Hall project has started with the painting of the walls by our maintenance and trades staff. The walk-through metal detectors that were approved at the last meeting should be here mid-June and after discussion with CEIA, we were able to remove the training cost of \$7,200. We will be sending a couple of staff to CEIA for training for a savings of about \$4,000. We contacted West Plains Engineering to do a microstudy regarding the parking lot LED lighting to make sure we are getting the right equipment. The last item is the fire alarm system; had a good meeting with Tim Behlings, Fire Marshall, and Jaime Stampe, with Skyline Engineering regarding the creation of a proposal for options for the outdated system. More information will be forthcoming. Heitsch stated as we continue to move forward with each of these projects more information will be brought to the Board.

Kraemer commented on some of the activities she has seen regarding "Vote Yes" campaign. Short discussion followed.

Miscellaneous:

1) Transportation Natural Gas Bid

Dzintars explained the bids were opened last Friday with Sequent Energy and Rainbow Gas submitting. Both bid prices came in identical at \$.30 below the Colorado Rockies Gas Market Index. Each company had some supplemental information that was reviewed. After review, no other information separated the two bids, therefore, as required by ordinance a lottery was held, Sequent Energy won the lottery. Motion was made by Landguth and seconded by Brown to move forward with Sequent Energy for the bid for Transportation Natural Gas. Upon vote being taken, the motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business, motion was made by Brown and seconded by Landguth **to adjourn the meeting**. Upon vote being taken, the motion carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 9:04 a.m.
