

## Experience

In addition to contracted work with individual nonprofits in the Black Hills and across the Midwest, INP is involved in community impact projects in the local area.

INP has sub-contracted with the White House Community Violence Intervention Collaborative (CVIC), a cohort of 16 jurisdictions committed to strengthening their infrastructure to prevent and respond to community violence. The nation-wide initiative is anchored by Cities United, Community Based Public Safety Collective, Health Alliance for Violence Intervention (HAVI), and the National Institute of Criminal Justice Reform. INP directly contributed by coaching 3 local, native-led organizations in Rapid City who are providing innovative services to those experiencing homelessness, substance use, correctional issues, and food insecurity.

INP offers marketing support to the “We Connect Community Toolkit” as a collaborative project between the Black Hills Regional Homeless Coalition and the Rapid City Police Dept. This project provides community education on the variables involved in housing insecurity and introduces the crisis co-response project for street outreach and linkage to care as an additional solution for the individual and community.

INP hosts free educational workshops in partnership with the Black Hills Area Community Foundation. Participants include representatives from nonprofits supporting the arts and history, human services, recreation and education.
