Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Rapid City was held at City Hall, Council Chambers, 300 Sixth Street, in Rapid City, South Dakota on Monday, March 6, 2023, at 6:30 P.M.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Motion was made by Jones, second by Armstrong and carried 10-0 to adopt the agenda.

MAYOR'S ITEMS

Mayor Allender read in item (No. CC030623-02.1) Confirm Appointment of Daniel Ainslie as Director of the Rapid City Finance Department and Authorize Mayor and Interim Finance Director to sign employment contract. Motion was made by Salamun, second by Lehmann and carried 10-0 to approve.

Mayor Allender read in item (No. CC030623-02.2) Tracy Davis, Interim Finance Director, swore in Daniel Ainslie as Director of the Rapid City Finance Department. Salamun thanked Davis for all of her hard work filling in as the Interim Finance Director.

PRESENTATION

Stephanie Mayfield, Executive Director of West River AHEC (Area Health Education Center) gave a presentation on a community CNA Training Program in cooperation with Monument Health; along with Shanon Waldner, MSN, MHA, Senior Director of Professional Practice and Development with Monument Health. Rural Health Works South Dakota was given an H-1B Rural Healthcare Grant. It was one of 17 Department of Labor Grants awarded in the US, given \$2.5 million over four years. The grant has reached 885 people across South Dakota. This is a great opportunity for anyone 18 or older; unemployed, under-employed, of incumbent workers looking to upskill; Nursing Assistants; Licenses Practical Nurses; or Registered Nurses (AND and BSN). They were thanked for their efforts in presenting new opportunities through this grant process.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT (3-minute time limit per speaker)

Ron Sasso stated the city website regarding elections needs to contain more information. He also said that more information should be available regarding previous candidates and their financial statement. He thinks there should be a run-off election for Mayor if the winning candidate doesn't have over 50% of the vote. He wants council to change that ordinance before the election.

Mayor Allender read in item (PW022823-21) Approve Request from KLJ Engineering on behalf of owner NDN Holdings, LLC for a variance to waive the requirement to install sidewalk along Country Road; and Deny variance to waive requirement to install sidewalk along Haines Avenue, per City Ordinance 12.08.060. Motion was made by Lehmann, second by Jones to continue this item to the March 20, 2023 City Council Meeting, per the applicant’s request. Motion carried 10-0.

NON-CONSENT ITEMS – Items 39 and 40

The following comments were given for Item 40. Natalie Johnson, Youth City Council member and student, is opposed to the new curriculum. She said her opinion does not reflect the opinions of Youth City Council as a whole. Garrett Pfeiffer thinks the only opinions that should matter, should be the teachers since they will have to implement the curriculum. Reasons to deny the new curriculum are feasibility, and if the information is even prudent or appropriate. Teacher retention is hard to come by. They shouldn’t be given more to teach. Annie Bachund stated the proposed standards are not standards

instead it is a proposed curriculum. This curriculum relies heavily on rote learning, not critical thinking. Donna Robinson, prior educator, urged the council to support the opposition of the new standards. Shaun Nielsen, middle school teacher, served on the 2021 worth group and 2022 Governor's revision Commission. Although the curriculum is being used in different parts of the country, public schools have far different challenges than private or charter schools. By passing the resolution, it sends the message that the council is listening. The people are 85% opposed to the new curriculum. He wants common sense to prevail. Sarah Gross spoke, saying she has been a teacher for 17 years. She feels the curriculum has inappropriate expectations. She is fearful that great teachers will leave teaching. She indicated that South Dakota is underfunding education. She said teachers need to be heard in other places because they need help getting the word out that this new curriculum is not the right decision. Kyle Krause, community member and father in Rapid City. He believes this decision is bad for the community. He knows teachers are short on time, and they can't teach the new standards without sacrificing other things students need. He asked that the council support the teachers by opposing the new standards.

Ordinances

Mayor Allender read in item (LF021523-02) Second Reading of Ordinance No. 6563 Regarding Supplemental Appropriation #1 for 2023. Having passed its first reading on February 21, 2023, motion was made by Nordstrom, second by Jones that the title be read the second time. Upon vote being taken, the following voted AYE: Nordstrom, Ham, Strommen, Salamun, Roberts, Jones, Lehmann, Evans, Armstrong, and Roseland; NO: None; whereupon the Mayor declared the motion passed and Ordinance No. 6563 was declared duly passed upon its second reading.

Council Items & Liaison Reports

Mayor Allender read in item (LF030123-11) Approve Resolution No. 2023-021 a Resolution Expressing Opposition to the Adoption of the Proposed Social Studies Content Standards Currently Under Consideration by the South Dakota Board of Education Standards – Pat Jones. Motion was made by Jones, second by Armstrong to approve. Jones and Armstrong spoke against the new curriculum. Jones advocated for the resolution. He wanted everyone involved to know the council is listening and support them. Evans said the standard was originated out of state. He is not in favor of the new standard. Nordstrom said he would support the School Boards decision to reject the new standard. Roll call was taken with Jones, Evans, Roseland, Nordstrom and Armstrong voting yes; and Lehmann, Salamun, Ham, Roberts and Strommen voting no. There was a 5-5 tie vote. Mayor Allender stated that he read through the standards. He thinks the new standards are hard and unrealistic. He said teachers don't have extra time in their day to learn and teach these standards. He stated that social studies wasn't part of standardized test. The teachers already give so much of themselves and it's not fair to as them to take this on. Mayor Allender broke the tie vote with an aye vote. Motion passed 6-5.

RESOLUTION No. 2023-021

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO THE ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED SOCIAL STUDIES CONTENT STANDARDS CURRENTLY UNDER CONSIDERATION BY THE SOUTH DAKOTA BOARD OF EDUCATION STANDARDS.

WHEREAS the South Dakota Board of Education Standards is considering a proposed revision to the South Dakota Social Studies Content Standards; and

WHEREAS hundreds of South Dakota education professionals have publicly expressed their opposition to the proposed standards; and

WHEREAS the Department of education has received at least 940 public comments in opposition to the standards, which constituted 86% of all public comments received by the Departments as of the last public hearing on the standards; and

WHEREAS the Board of Education for Rapid City Area Schools has unanimously passed a resolution opposing the adoption of the proposed standards; and

WHEREAS Elevate Rapid City, the area’s largest economic development organization, has publicly opposed adopting the proposed standards; and

WHEREAS our schools are directly tied to both economic development and the overall success Rapid City; and

WHEREAS it is our duty to protect and promote the interests of Rapid City and its residents.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rapid City Common Council opposes the adoption of the proposed Social Studies Content Standards currently under consideration.
