SIGN APPLICATIONS

806 Saint Joseph Street (16SN032)

Applicant: Signs Now

District: Downtown Commercial District, contributing, built c.a., 1919

Request: Install (1) 10' x 2' Wall sign and (1) 4' x 2' Wall Sign for Spore Creative

Hanzel presented the application to the committee and introduced Slack to the committee.

In response to a question from Blada, Slack stated that the colors and shape of the signs would be similar to the neighboring business, Lovestruck Bridal.

Slack stated that the sign material is MDO board with vinyl lettering in response to a question from Fenhaus.

Jackson moved to approve the installation of (1) 10' x 2' Wall sign and (1) 4' x 2' Wall Sign at 806 Saint Joseph Street. The motion was seconded by Fenhaus and carried unanimously.

612 Saint Joseph Street (16SN033)

Applicant: Craig Stump

District: Downtown Commercial District, contributing, built c.a. 1900

Request: Remove existing aluminum marquee, install new awning and new 2' x 18.75' wall sign for Again Books and Bazaar

Hanzel reviewed the application with the committee.

In response to questions from the committee, Stump explained the color and texture for the new awning and that the wall sign will be one large MDO panel. Stump further explained that the letters on the wall sign and the awning will be painted with automotive paint. Stump also stated that the wall sign will be flush against the building and the awning will come out from the wall. Discussion ensued.

Fenhaus moved to approve the installation of new awning and new 2' x 18.75' wall sign at 612 Saint Joseph Street. The motion was seconded by Jackson and carried unanimously.

Stump exited the meeting.
